Amy Boutwell, M.D., M.P.P. CEO, Collaborative Healthcare Strategies

Amy Boutwell, M.D., M.P.P., founded Collaborative Healthcare Strategies to pursue work aligned with the opportunities created by the Affordable Care Act, the CMS Center for Innovation and the Partnership for Patients, specifically with the goal of engaging thousands of communities across the nation to work across settings and sectors to improve healthcare delivery. Dr. Boutwell was the co-designer of the Institute for Healthcare Improvement's STAAR Initiative (State Action on Avoidable Readmissions), known best for its emphasis on cross-setting, multi-stakeholder approaches to improving transitions in communities. Dr Boutwell currently advises state and national efforts focused on achieving the three-part aim, and works at the intersection of all best practices and approaches to improve care transitions, without exclusive adherence to one particular model – taking the best from what is known to be effective, practical and efficient in improving care transitions.

Dr. Boutwell is a graduate of Stanford University, Brown University School of Medicine and the Harvard Kennedy School of Government, where she received a master's degree in public policy and the Robert F. Kennedy Award for Excellence in Public Service. Dr. Boutwell is a practicing physician at Newton-Wellesley Hospital, attends on the medicine teaching service at Massachusetts General Hospital and is an Instructor in medicine at Harvard Medical School.

Cindy Hupke, BSN, MBA
Director, Institute for Healthcare Improvement (IHI)

Cindy Hupke, BSN, MBA, is a Director within the Institute for Healthcare Improvement (IHI) and is a content lead for IHI's Triple Aim for Population Health. Her focus over the last 15 years has focused on leading large, strategic population health initiatives to improve population outcomes at scale, with a particular focus on reducing disparities and inequities. Those initiatives included the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Health Resources and Services Administration's Health Disparities Collaboratives and the Indian Health Service's Improving Patient Care Collaboratives. Her work with these initiatives has reached more than 800 health centers and clinics across the United States. She developed and leads the IHI seminar on the Transformation of Primary Care Practices and is an active participant in ongoing development of leadership and spread content within IHI.

**Grace Wang, PhD Senior Researcher, American Institutes for Research** 

Grace Wang is a health services and policy researcher with primary interests in evaluating and measuring public health programs on health, experience, and cost outcomes. Dr. Wang is Co-Director of the American Institute for Research's Triple Aim Measurement Instrument development initiative (funded by the Blue Shield of California Foundation). Dr. Wang has led mixed method studies to understand the adoption of new technologies in health care systems, the effectiveness of public private partnerships on community mental health services, and health care transitions experienced by youth with disabilities. Dr. Wang also has experience conducting economic evaluations and decision modeling to examine prevention of cancer and changes in quality adjusted life years in relation to costs. She has synthesized and translated findings into guidance for researchers and decision makers, including state and federal-level policy makers. Dr. Wang holds degrees from the University of Pennsylvania, The George Washington University, and the University of Washington.

# Rachel Wick Program Officer, Blue Shield of California Foundation

Rachel Wick is a program officer for the Foundation's Health Care and Coverage program. In this role, she supports the Foundation's grantmaking and programmatic work related to improving access to healthcare services for the underserved, and strengthening systems of care in California's safety net.

Prior to joining the Foundation, Ms. Wick was the director for policy, planning and special projects at the Consumer Health Foundation, a private health foundation in the Washington, D.C. region. She led the development, implementation, and evaluation of the Foundation's strategic plan.
