Ending domestic violence requires working across generations to prevent childhood exposure, while also strengthening prevention and healing. To break this multigenerational cycle, we focus on directly addressing its root causes.

Align systems with community priorities

By supporting stronger and more responsive relationships between communities and systems, we engender greater resilience in both. We champion community-led processes and policy shifts, narrative change, and collaborative efforts that bring multiple sectors together to prioritize health and well-being.
